- Lets industry/academia/non-profits share lessons learned, best practices, tutorials, tools

**Desired impact:** Maximize sharing of *actionable* learning, connection point for pre-existing communities of interest.

## GSA Why do sustainable supply chains matter?

- Remove costs due to supply chain inefficiencies & risk from products/services procured by US Govt.
- Resiliency and efficient supply chains = increased competitiveness
- Increased opportunity for small businesses who invest in becoming “sustainable” to become part of larger supply chains

## GSA Seeding the community

- Covers seven market sectors: IT, Furniture, Building materials, Food concessions, Waste management, Apparel, Professional Services
- Special emphasis on:
  - Traceability and identification of priority impacts
    - Life cycle, baselining, data capture
  - Supplier engagement, especially small businesses
    - Codes of conduct, tutorials, checklists, etc.
  - Optimizing transportation
